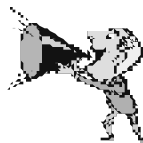

Carl Liaupsin earns the Carl Fenichel Memorial Award

Carl was recently awarded the Carl Fenichel Memorial Award that is provided annually for the best research paper submitted by a student. This award is named in honor of Carl Fenichel, a child psychiatrist who pioneered the provision of programs based on a milieu therapy model. After his death, the Fenichel School, which he had founded, approached CCBD with the idea of offering an annual

award in his name. The first award was given during the 1980 CEC convention in Philadelphia. Even after the Fenichel School withdrew its financial support, CCBD continues to honor students with this award.

Once again, we offer a hearty congratulation to Carl Liaupsin for earning this prestigious award. Be sure to see him at the Louisville conference and let him know how much we appreciate this wonderful accomplishment.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

Teacher of the Year Nomination

The purpose of this award is to recognize a Kentucky classroom teacher who demonstrates the commitment, professionalism and characteristics that would exemplify the highest standard to qualifying them as "One of the Best." Only KY-CCBD members may make nominations. Nominee does not have to be a KY-CCBD Member. The award will be presented at the Behavior Institute 2001. Three top nominees will be recognized; the Teacher of the Year will be selected from these finalists. KY-CCBD Executive Board will determine final candidates and the Teacher of the Year. Members of the Executive Board and Regional Representatives are not eligible for the award.

What characteristics are we looking for?

- 1) Quality of service to children with disabilities displaying emotional and behavior challenges.
- 2) Involvement in professional/community activities supporting children with disabilities for whom behavior is a challenge.
- 3) Demonstrated commitment to the involvement of parents and community agencies as partners in service to students.

was agreeing to, I accepted. I then learned there was only \$200 in the organization's bank account and was given a print out of CCBBD members in Kentucky. As I read the names many were colleagues from across the state that I had worked and socialized with over the years.

A small number of us would meet at the Fall Conference every year but nothing seemed to be moving forward. This group decided to try and get organized and so a newsletter was sent to the members. The members of KY-CCBD had expressed an interest in trying to get something going and revitalize the organization.

As a result an election was held and I was selected as president. However, due to a family tragedy, I was unable to serve. The group took over, I dropped out.

When I returned there was a Behavior Institute underway. There also were strands organized for both the fall and spring CEC conferences. Since the re-emergence of KY-CCBD, over 5,000 professionals have been trained. Ladies and gentlemen, we have come a long way, but still have a way to go before the kids we serve achieve success.

While considering the future I recalled a phrase I learned from Dan Orman "Change is mandatory. Growth is optional." KY-CCBD is attempting growth because of the changes that occur naturally as an organization matures. The organization of the tasks necessary to continue offer the Behavior Institute annually is an example of growth.

We are looking for you, the members, to become more involved in, your conference. Many have offered to help and the executive committee has not always taken advantage of your offer; that needs to change. You may be contacted with a request to help. If so, and you can, your help will be appreciated. If no one gets in touch with you, get in touch with us. As we grow we may not be as coordinated as we would like, so bear with us.

We are planning to hold the Behavior Institute in Louisville for the next two years, which will save on costs. The anticipated dates are June 25, 26 and 27 (Monday through Wednesday). We will ask the membership to confirm the plans at the general KY-CCBD meeting at 4:45 – 5:45 on Monday November 17th at the Fall CEC

I ask you to hear what they said. We do make a difference!

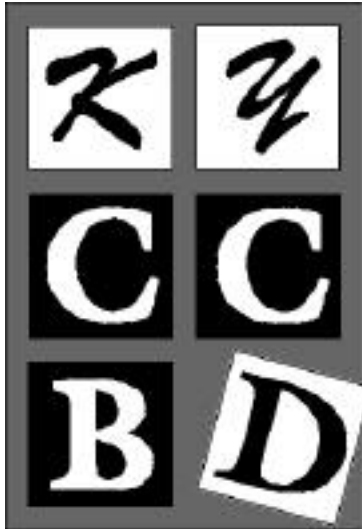
